


What to be doing now...

- Use/create professional emails (school email is fine)
- Start thinking about courses for senior year
 - Balance & Challenge
 - Align with college requirements
- Research colleges/(virtual) campus visits
- Plan for standardized tests *

Research Colleges + Build Working College List

- Use Naviance and college websites for data-driven decisions
- Working college list Naviance "Colleges I'm Thinking About"
 - Safety (2-3) *Your* chances for admission are strong
 (Make sure at least one is affordable)
 - Target (2-3) *Your* chances for admission are 50/50
 - Reach (2-3) *Your* chances for admission are less than 50%





Building a Resume

- Naviance Resume Builder
- Resume uses applications, letters of recommendation
- COVID effects on extracurriculars
- Extracurricular activities **high school** specific
- Showcase what you do and the depth of the activity
- Include: family responsibilities (i.e. babysitting), employment, clubs, etc.
- Highlight leadership and the impact on your community when applicable

Letters of Recommendation

Adults who know you well can offer a helpful perspective on

your abilities and strengths

- Whom to ask?
 - o 2 teachers, 2 different disciplines
 - 1 counselor letter
- When to ask?
- Outside/Additional Letters of Rec *
- Say thank you!

Essays

Your application essay says a lot about you

- Share something meaningful/personal/passionate
- Start writing early
- Try different topics and approaches
- Plagiarism is taken <u>very</u> seriously
- Leave time for careful proofreading
- Check Commonapp.org for essay prompts



Interviews

Virtual "face-to-face" conversations let colleges see the person behind the application

- Two types: 1. Informational and 2. Evaluative
- •Be prepared to answer open-ended questions
- •Know your reasons for applying to the college
- Ask thoughtful questions
- Cover the basics
- •Relax and be yourself

Changes/Updates in Colleges Admissions*

1. College Level Changes

- Flexibility and understanding
- College Websites go-to source for information
- Current Test-Optional Movement *
- New: COVID Essay Prompt

2. How Bromfield is Acknowledging The Changes:

- School Profile (sent with transcripts senior year):
 - It highlights COVID changes w/ Bromfield & the COVID grading policy
- Counselor letters of recommendation:
 - Will focus on class of 2022 sophomore spring semester + their current hybrid/remote model

Engaging with Colleges Virtually During COVID

- Reinvented opportunities for connections; students need to access them
- Demonstrated interest
- Making the connection with the institution
 - Online tours
 - Info sessions
 - Virtual open house, art showcase, etc
 - o Email
 - opening the dialogue w/ admissions rep (ex: questions about the campus life, curriculum, etc)
 - open/read the emails from colleges
 - Research college websites, including blogs by current students
 - Social media the "campus vibe"
- If visits are possible, students:
 - must fill out the <u>Bromfield College Visit Form</u> at least 5 days before visits, for prior approval
 - they should make every effort to schedule a visit on an asynchronous learning day

Standardized Testing (COVID updates)

• Test Optional (SAT/ACT)

• Majority colleges went test-optional for Class of 2021

• Some did a one year pilot, some did a 3 year pilot

- NACAC; <u>fairtest.org</u>: great starting place, but college websites have most up-to-date COVID information
- Testing is one area that students have had no control over
 - Flexibility & understanding
 - What does <u>test optional</u> really mean?
 - Test optional truly is optional
 - No pressure to submit
 - Admissions rep said, "Standardized tests are simply a **credential**, students can **choose** to submit it or not. They are just one credential among many."
- If considering submitted scores, visit colleges websites to find average SAT/ACT scores

Standardized Tests

• 2020 vs 2021

- SAT vs ACT
 - Check SAT/ACT websites for registration dates
 - Both the SAT and ACT offer free test prep online
 - SAT Subject Tests & AP Exams show subject knowledge

Miscellaneous FYI's

College Application Deadline Options

- Early Deadlines generally November/December
 Early Action early deadline, non-binding

 - o Early Decision early deadline, binding
- Regular Deadlines generally after January 1st
 Regular Decision later deadline, non-binding
 Early Decision 2- later deadline, binding(if available)
- Other Deadlines
 - Rolling Admission early deadline, non-binding
 - Open Admission Community colleges
- Deadlines are important! Make sure to stay on track.

NCAA

- NCAA Eligibility Center– eligibilitycenter.org
 - Div I or II Sports
- Add "NCAA" to Naviance list
- Add The Bromfield School to the NCAA account
- Email Mrs. Schmidt to let her know you need your transcript uploaded to the Eligibility Center
- *Standardized test scores required? TBD

Staying on Track

Spring/Summer Junior Year

- Research colleges
- Visit campuses & college fairs*
- Ask teachers for letters of recommendation
- Take the SAT/ACT
- Meaningful Time
- Common App (Aug 1st) Essays & Supplements
- Update Resume
- Senior Project

Fall Senior Year

- Retake the SAT/ACT
- Secure letters of recommendation
- Finalize the college essay(s)
- Complete all admissions applications
- Submit financial aid applications
- Parent Brag Sheet
- Info for Counselor Recommendation(Naviance)

Winter Senior Year

- Submit admissions applications
- Submit financial aid applications
- Apply for scholarships
- Send in mid-year grade reports

Spring Senior Year

- Receive admissions and financial aid offers
- Attend college open house programs
- Choose your college by May 1

Social Media

- Be aware of what is on the internet
- Clean up accounts
 - Photos
 - o Posts
- Change settings to private
- Cautious of friend requests
